EXPECTATIONS OF CAMPERS:

We expect campers to show respect and kindness toward animals, camp counselors and other campers at all times. We further expect campers to follow all safety instructions. Please discuss this with your child before coming to camp so that they are ready to participate upon arrival. Our staff will remind campers of the expectations if needed, and any repeated incidents may require a phone call to parents or removal from camp activities.

COVID-19 PREVENTION

Help us reduce the spread of COVID-19 – together, we can have a fun, safer time at camp. Follow all verbal, written, and posted safety instructions, including, but not limited to, the following:

1. Facemasks are required. All campers, staff, and visitors (including parents/guardians) must wear a two-layered mask that securely covers the nose, mouth, and chin at all times while at spcaLA (indoors and outdoors), unless eating or drinking.
2. Parents or caregivers are required to perform a pre-camp health screening every morning before attending camp.
3. Please keep your child at home if camper has any of the following symptoms prior to camp
 - Temperature is not to be 100.4 degrees or above (please check each morning before attending camp)
 - Cough
 - Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
 - Fatigue
 - Muscle or body aches
 - Headache
 - New loss of taste or smell
 - Sore throat
 - Congestion or runny nose
 - Nausea or vomiting
 - Diarrhea

4. Notify spcaLA immediately if your camper or a member of your household:
 - a. Is experiencing symptoms of COVID-19;
 - b. Has been in close contact with someone who has had a positive COVID-19 test result in the past 10 days;
 - c. Any of the above are true within 10 days after the camper was at spcaLA.
5. Maintain social distance, as instructed by spcaLA.
6. Frequently wash and/or disinfect hands for at least 20 seconds.
7. Do not share food, water, or personal items.

Please anticipate follow-up questions if you need to contact spcaLA regarding COVID-19 symptoms or exposure. If a camper begins exhibiting symptoms of illness while at spcaLA, they will be isolated and their parent/guardian will be contacted for immediate pick-up.

If a camper, or their parents/guardians, choose not to follow safety instructions, they will be removed from camp and no refund will be issued.

BE PREPARED – CAMPERS SHOULD:

1. Eat a hearty breakfast. spcaLA will not provide snacks/meals, nor is there a designated snack time.
2. Bring a full bottle of water. Label it clearly with their name.
3. Pack an extra two-layered facemask, a pair of long pants, and any medication/items the camper may need while at camp. Parents/guardians must disclose any medication/allergies/disabilities/illness that may affect your child at camp to spcaLA.

DRESS REQUIREMENTS:

1. A two-layered facemask. Facemasks may be reusable or disposable, but must be clean and undamaged at the start of each day. Facemasks must cover the nose, mouth, and chin. Face shields may not be used as an alternative to facemasks.
2. Long pants. Campers must wear long pants for dog training. Campers may wear shorts as long as they bring long pants to change into. Campers will not be allowed to dog train without long pants. Capris do not count as long pants. Due to Covid-19, “loaner” pants will NOT be available.
3. Closed-toe shoes for dog training.
4. A hair tie, if the camper has long hair.
5. Hats and sunscreen are optional, but recommended. Campers will spend a lot of time outdoors.

DROPPING OFF/PICKING UP:

Camp runs from 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. Drop off time for students is 8:30 a.m. One parent per child may drop off at the Education Center of the spcaLA, which is located to the right as you drive towards the building from the parking lot. A check-in area will be set up outside and will be clearly marked to indicate physical distancing. Parents or caregivers must bring their own pens when signing campers in. Please

do not bring siblings, friends, family, or pets while dropping off and picking up.

Please be sure to pick your child up promptly at 12:30 p.m., as you might be charged additional fees if your child remains after the pick-up time.

CANCELLATION POLICY:

If spcaLA must cancel a camp session in advance due to public health concerns related to COVID-19, those who have registered for those sessions will receive full refunds. If camp must close mid-week, those registered will receive a prorated refund. In all other cases, refunds will be provided if requested at least three weeks before the start of the session in which your child is enrolled. There is a 10% processing fee for these cancellations.

MEDICATIONS/DISABILITIES/SEVERE ALLERGIES:

If your child is in need of medications of any sort, please notify Debra Sutton, prior to your child attending camp. Camp staff will not be responsible for administering medication to campers. If your child has a disability, please inform Debra Sutton. Many disabilities can be accommodated, but there are a few that cannot. For the safety of the campers and the animals, please inform Debra Sutton of any disabilities, illnesses, allergies or medications that could affect your child at camp. Failure to disclose any information about your child's disability, medical condition, or severe allergy that could potentially hinder the safety of your child, other children, or the shelter animals may result in dismissal from camp without a refund. Please understand that our camp staff are not trained in special education or occupational therapy. Of course, we will make realistic attempts to make camp accessible to all students.

spcaLA'S FRIENDS FOR LIFE CAMP™ PARENT/CAMPER CHECKLIST

- Two-layered facemask (if reusable, must be washed daily)
- Long pants (Capris do not count as long pants.)
- Closed-toe shoes
- Labeled, full bottle of water
- Any medications or other needed items (i.e. snack for low blood sugar, insulin, inhaler, allergy medications, etc.).
- Hair tie, hat, and/or sunscreen
- Note allowing an alternate adult to pick up your child, if needed.

FROM 605 SOUTH:

Exit at Spring St./Cerritos Ave.
Turn right on Spring St.
Turn left at the first stop light into El Dorado Park.

FROM 605 NORTH:

Exit at Katella Ave./Willow St.
Continue on Willow St.
Turn right on Studebaker Rd.
Turn right on Spring St.
Turn right into El Dorado Park.

FROM 405 SOUTH:

Exit at Studebaker Rd.
Turn left on Studebaker Rd.
Turn right on Spring St.
Turn right into El Dorado Park.

When you enter El Dorado Park, tell the guard that you are visiting spcaLA (there will be no charge for parking). Turn left immediately past the guard shack, and follow the paw prints on the pavement around to the right. The road curves to the left before you enter our parking lot. Camp will be held in the building marked "Education Center" toward the right side of the parking lot.
